- **KNOW THE LOCATION**
- **TAKE CARE OF YOURSELF AND FOLLOW ALL SAFETY PROTOCOLS**
- **PACK SAFETY AND BASIC ESSENTIALS**
- **PACK IT IN - PACK IT OUT**
Whatever trash, belongings, and miscellaneous items you bring with you should be taken with you or properly disposed of.
- **LEAVE WHAT YOU FIND**
Never take things from the trails that may impact the local fauna and wildlife. Never create structures that impede trails and ecosystem. Never destroy naturally built structures that may house wildlife.
- **DISPOSE OF ANY LITTER**
- **WILDLIFE PROTOCOL**
Never disturb the wildlife. Do not feed any animals on site. Do not approach any animals on site. If you encounter an injured animal onsite, note the location and let a CWE Staff Member know.
- **PROPER PET HANDLING**
Pets should be kept on leashes while on campus trails. All pet waste should be picked up and disposed of properly.
